What is Your Land Trying to Tell You?



The Sustainable Iowa Land Trust works with landowners to permanently protect land to grow fruits, vegetables and livestock in a way that improves our soil, water and air quality.

What does "permanent protection" mean?

A land protection agreement – called a conservation easement – attached to your deed, reducing land costs for future farmers. A donation of some or all of your land to SILT, so future farmers get a lifetime opportunity to farm with the option to purchase the buildings.

What do we mean by "food?"

lowa's climates and soils can grow nuts, berries, melons, veggies, leafy greens, all kinds of meat, poultry and pork on open land.
